## St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara The Man of Letters: WHO TRANSFORMED KERALA THROUGH PRINTING IN THE 19TH CENTURY

St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born to Kuriakose and Mariam on February 10, 1805 at Kainakary, Kuttanad which is a land of lakes and lagoons, coconut trees and paddy fields.
The I9th Century Kerala which was a paradise of earth was not a comfortable place for the common man to live due to the existence of a lot of social discriminations and inequalities. Under privileged sections of the society as a result was destined to face a lot of troubles. St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara who lived and worked in this era as a Christian priest, turned to be a social reformer and awakened the consciousness of the people of Kerala towards a social transformation. He was a man of action and contemplation.
He revolutionized Kerala, with education, printing technology, establishment of old age homes, initiatives of noon meal system for the poor students, women empowerment and other social reforms. He started indigenous Christian religious life in Kerala. Founded the CMI and CMC religious congregation for men and women respectively. He popularized vernacular literature. He was a man of principles and values.
His "Chavarul" is his instructions for the families to uphold the family values and moral principles. He made special emphasis on the ideal upbringing of the kids at home. St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara loved the
nature by planting trees and encouraging others to do the same. He distributed mango trees through his monastery to the people around to plant and nurture it.
If I attempt to sketch all the revolutionary changes that St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara materialized in the history of Kerala, in these limited pages, I know I will be doing injustice to this great luminary.
Hence I try only to point out a bit on his attempts to transform Kerala with his printing revolution, he initiated in the year 1846.
Anyone who is interested to know the origin and development of printing in Kerala, will have to go through the chronicles written by Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara (I8051871) which is kept in the archives of St. Joseph's Monastery, Mannanam, Kottayam Dt., Kerala.
A real lover of the letters will be thrilled to know that in the history of vernacular printing, ones and above the foreign evangelists and government machinery there was an individual a Keralite, who all alone organized a print revolution which led Kerala to modernity. Through a door made of paper and printing we can walk into the history of Kerala. There is only very limited study in Malayalam to know how the printing machine and printed books shaped modernity in Kerala. Printing and print driven modernity became the platform for the social transformation in our state.
Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara's "Plantain Pith Revolution" (Vazhathada Viplavam) tells us a real life story of a man who had a vision and dedication with a purpose and decision. This is the story of the creation of the mould of a printing machine using Plantain pith by Saint Chavara.
The beginning of printing and books in Kerala originated initially with the coming of Christian Evangelists from abroad. The first among them were Benjamin Bailey and Herman

Gundert. Bailey and Gundert started printing presses in Kottayam in the year 1822 and at Thalassery in the year 1845. There was also the presence of a Malayali, the Maharaja of Travancore, Sri. Swathi Thirunal, who started the government printing press at Thiruvananthapuram in the year 1836.
History cannot overlook the fact that besides the foreign missionaries and the governmental machinery there is a personal stream in the history of printing in Kerala. In the history of indigenous printing in Kerala St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara will ever remember as the initiator of this revolutionary step in the midst of a number of problems and obstacles.
In 1846 Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara started the St. Joseph's Press at Mannanam, which stands as the first non-governmental printing press of the Keralites. The great visionary successfully introduced the printing technology for the common people. The most attractive factor behind the establishment of the printing press at Mannanam was the "Plantain Pith Revolution" which I mentioned earlier. With all his plan to set up a printing machine, St. Chavara made two visits to CMS Press, Kottayam.

But he failed to get permission to see the printing machine. Without losing the hope he then went to Thiruvananthapuram and visited the government press. After reaching back at Mannanam he recalled all the functions of the printing press he watched at the government press, and created a mould of the same in a Plantain Pith and with the help of a carpenter he made a printing machine in wood. The tireless effort of St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, became a reality in the year 1846. The machine was installed by using a hard stone as the foundation, at St. Joseph's Monastery near Kottayam. This press named as St. Joseph's Press, gradually paved the way for the modernization of Kerala. This wooden press from which the first Malayalam Daily, Nasrani Deepika, was printed in the year 1887, is still preserved at the museum of St. Chavara Shrine at Mannanam.
This man of letters may ever remain as an inspiration to all the people who love letters and work in the field of media, printing and communication. Let us also try to transform and educate our society through the use of the modern developed versions of printing technology.

a moment and imagine the period where modern humans first originated. Close your eyes and imagine the dense forests they walked in. What made us superior amongst the rest was the wild and our ability to think and integrate with our sense organs. When simply said, the enemy is the wild predators and the solution is the five senses. Thus, for facing the wildlife, five senses are all that man needed.

Now if wildlife was the only task that was there for us, we wouldn't have had to use any further science. However, today's enemy is not the wildlife. When analyzed the colonizing, it is clear that we have a more dangerous enemy to overcome. And this time, using mathematics as our weapon. However, reasons for colonizing are manifold.
These are the major 3 ideas I believe why colonizing is a need

Let us suppose we never caused any harm to our earth, even then, earth is to face a natural death of its own. 2) Economics too supports colonizing. As Hans Rosling, a statistician who has commented on various occasions about population peaks including in a TEDx talk has
said, the population of the world will never rise beyond II billion \{details can be referred as it is beyond the scope of this article\}. While it may sound good news to the earth lovers who would justify this as to why we can sustain on earth, it is important to note how well the II billion would fit into this planet. As it would take a lot of explanation, I have mentioned the amount of food supplied by various parts of the world in a graph attached. Now consider the fact that Asian countries will have the greatest population explosion. Thus, we see a huge disparity that is going to occur in terms of availability of food vs people per region. True, there are many optimistic views by many individuals who provide solutions as to how we can manage a controlled redistribution and how population explosion can be controlled. My opinion is these are possibilities that we can work on, but it is never a reason for avoiding colonizing. Simply said, when deeply observed, all these solutions demand an extraordinary level of global zco-operation which I believe is never going to happen.

3) Many individuals hold the viewpoint that colonizing means leaving the earth. It is a huge misconception. Colonizing is simply networking. Colonization is not to be viewed as the rebirth of the human race, but rather as our future in which our limits are not bound to just one planet. This is simply a mean to expand the territory of our race so that destruction to any one territory doesn't result in extinction.
While there are a number of other reasons I would like to present, I present these major points as to why colonizing is an absolute necessity for our survival.
Convincing society is the need of the hour.

I owe this whole section to one speech that Neil Degrasse Tyson had told which has deeply influenced me. He shared how he wondered what made humans undertake huge decisions that required the input of a large group or society. This includes the building of pyramids, the moon landing etc. He said while we call ourselves as curious beings interested in doing things to explore and discover, surprisingly when it came to action, there were simply 3 motives - Faith, Competition and fear of death. Faith brought people together building the pyramids while competition fueled the space race and British colonization. Using this as my reference added to the fact that a study conducted at Harvard stated how humans responded to emotions more than factual evidence, I hypothesize that the greatest motive for which humans shall be interested in colonizing will be competition. Space race must take a full-fledged form in the 21 st century and this time, industrialists and business magnates (Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos being the earliest entries) must actively participate in it realizing the potential gain in being able to individually conquer unearthly lands. While I can talk about how humans can collectively work, I see no practicality in it. Thus, competition must be encouraged to boost colonizing.


This is specifically a topic to be discussed.
I have spent a lot of my IOth grade thinking about and I have formulated a plan which would be able to increase our chances which had occurred to me back then.

I call it the Ultra-Minimalistic-reworking attempt and is based on an existing philosophy of minimalism. Minimalism is a philosophy that encourages the minimum usage of items and methods to reduce waste. Now I shall use this as a framework to my method. My
idea is to not think of colonizing as a project for scientists but as a collective mission. More specifically, politicians, health organizations and cultural heads of various parts of the world must hold collective meetings as to how would it be established in the new planet. For instance, health and medical departments must experiment on various surgical procedures in environments that are limiting and difficult in space or a potential new planet. Research fields of botany must see colonizing as an important project and work on varieties of plants that would be suitable for the new environment. In other words, it must be a global phenomenon which people are actively competing with neighboring nations. Hence, this is the "reworking" part of my plan.

Now about ultra-minimalism. There must be an active attempt in reusability and recycling. I prefer the former as it favours the new situations. I had the chance to meet a professor from China who shared his project of reusing plastics in various forms without ever really discarding it. Fields as such must be encouraged. It is also worthy to mention how Elon Musk visualizes how it is possible to completely reuse rockets for multiple trips.
So, this is about my ultra-minimalism and reworking plan.

In brief, it had been a long-held dream of mine to share this idea to at least a small group of people in a formal manner. Now I am sure this isn't a solution and is simply the words of an excited youth. But my attempt here is not to present my idea as the ultimate solution for colonializing but simply share with my readers how important it is to think about the coming issues and try thinking about solutions in your youth. After all, we are the responsible for the earth in the coming generation.
There still might be individuals who might ridicule the importance of this in the already problem filled world. Humans always had the ability to laugh at a distant issue until it was too near to avoid. Deforestation and related issues and global inequalities are some of these issues which individuals noticed but never took early action.
Thus, I anticipate this encourages at least some of my readers to think about tomorrow and together we shall somehow sustain the human race.

Access to information is necessary for the health of a Democracy.

Firstly, the people need to be informed to take better decisions and choices. Secondly, news has a "checking function" over the leaders and candidates. The media is the fourth estate and needs to check all political processes, candidates etc. It needs to be a watch dog and a catalyst of change. We assume it to

be the voice of people but we forget that it is a part of the government, crores power, is made of ambitious journalists pre-conceived ideas, prejudices and political leanings. Thus, censorship seems a better option but it imposed its constitutionality needs to be judged by section I9(2). The professional freedom of press was recently questioned by BJP's PM candidate Mr. Narendra Modi, when his pre-election interview was edited by Door-darshan. In this way, the media plays a controversial role and journalists become media scheme makers.
Thus, the media needs to realize that "with great power comes great responsibility" and that it is the foundation of democracy, which is of, by and for people. If the autonomous media adopts self-censorship, it will not be a threat to the democracy. The press should report only what needs to be reported and not what the people want. Thus, though the press informs us about issues and events, it is the public which decides "the AGENDA" for society. A change is possible only when the press becomes a tool in the hands of democracy, influences and satiates the perception of the people. The press needs to be controlled, otherwise its independence will overpower all. In the words of veteran editor S. Nihal Singh, "An amazing responsibility rests on the shoulders of the journalists because in the final analysis they are custodians of the freedom of the press".
